# Potassium-Rich Foods - You Need to Add To your Diet

The human body requires varying amounts of minerals daily to build strong bones and muscles. It also helps to maintain various bodily functions. Therefore, we obtain these nutrients from eating foods rich in minerals.

Potassium is one of the seven essential macrominerals. The human body needs potassium to support key processes. It helps maintain the water levels inside our cells. It is the third most found mineral in our body. It improves the circulation of fluids, nerve transmission, and muscle contraction control. Our cells contain almost 98 percent of the potassium in our body. The majority of this is present in our muscle tissue, and the remaining (20%) is found in our liver, bones, and red blood cells.

- Controls nerve impulses and muscle contractions
- Helps in maintaining fluid balance in the body.
- Maintains proper functioning of muscle and nervous system.

Potassium also works as an electrolyte in our bodies. Electrolytes conduct electricity in the body and help manage crucial functions in the body. Between the positive and negative ions present in electrolytes, potassium helps carry positively charged ions.



Eating sufficient potassium helps in water retention, reducing blood pressure, preventing kidney stones, etc. In addition to this, our body is 60% made up of water, potassium helps manage the water present inside our cells. Hence, it is important to feed our bodies with enough potassium.

# Spinach, Apples, Oranges, Tomatoes, Papaya, Bananas, Lemons, Celery, Mushrooms, Pecans, Raisins, Pineapple, Rice, Cucumbers, Strawberries, Figs, Brussels Sprouts, and Legumes

**Banana** -Bananas are one of the most popular sources of potassium. Bananas are a great source of potassium and other nutrients such as vitamin B6, magnesium, vitamin C, manganese, and fibre. They also lower blood pressure, better asthma symptoms, better heart health and reduce the risks of developing type 2 diabetes. Bananas are a healthy source of fibre and help you feel fuller for longer.

#### Re-Certification Audit of IMS Completed



Re-certification audit of IMS (Integrated Management System) was completed successfully. The audit was conducted at the site by the auditors from the certifying agency. The auditors inspected all relevant documents pertaining to IMS followed by a site visit and the interaction with different department in-charges and employees of ADHPL to assess the implementation status of Management Systems (ISO 9001; 2015, ISO 14001:2015 & ISO 45001: 2018). After the completion of the audit, the lead auditor from certifying agency recommended ADHPL for re-certification of IMS for another three years subject to the successful completion of surveillance audits.

Looking at the dangerous water levels, the Allain Barrage team closed the HR and bulkhead gates and flashed the message of emergency to control room PH. There have been more than 285 training sessions conducted with support from HEG Ltd

Overall GVT is working with 15,066 farmers in 23 districts of Madhya Pradesh and Maharashtra and 155.95 lakh fruit trees were planted. In the coming months, the goal is to reach 350 lakh fruit tree plantations cumulatively.

#### The Akshay Patra Foundation

Striving to end the hunger of underprivileged children and facilitate their education, The Akshaya Patra Foundation, a not-for-profit, Bangalore-based trust evolved a free

IGIA (Delhi), Bagdogra International Airport (Darjeeling, West Bengal) and Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose International Airport (Kolkata) are major airports serving direct flights to Paro Airport. There are no direct flights from Bangalore, Hyderabad, Mumbai and Chennai.
