In the domain of graphite electrodes, HEG Ltd. has officially announced the successful conclusion of its expansion project, elevating its capacity from 80,000 tons to 100,000 tons per annum. This achievement positions HEG as the largest Graphite Electrodes Plant globally under a single roof. HEG takes pride in its commitment to serving a majority of the world’s top 25 steel companies and exporting to over 35 countries worldwide. Graphite Electrodes, crucial in electric arc furnaces integral to steel production, play a pivotal role in our operations. Notably, this process emits only one-fourth of the carbon compared to traditional blast furnaces, making a substantial contribution to reducing carbon emissions and addressing climate change concerns. While most process shops were already operational in the preceding months, the final shop commenced commercial production on November 1, 2023. The expansion project incurred an approximate cost of INR 1200 crore and spanned three years.

Despite interruptions caused by the global COVID-19 pandemic in 2020 and 2021, the company achieved this milestone in record time. HEG has meticulously invested in state-of-the-art equipment and environmentally friendly technologies, positioning the plant as the latest and most modern in the world. As the global focus shifts towards decarbonization, Electric Arc Furnaces are increasingly favored over Blast Furnaces for their greener steel production, with carbon emissions reduced to one-fourth of the latter. With the successful completion of this expansion, HEG now stands as the third-largest Graphite electrode company in the western world. We look forward to continuing our commitment to excellence and sustainability in the steel industry.

The board also approved the expansion of TACC Limited’s graphite anode powder production capacity; this would enable the company to fulfill the increasing demand for cell manufacturing, with plans to expand from 10–12 GWH (10,000 MT) to 20–22 GWH (20,000 MT) in a single phase. The aim is to attain economies of scale.

India has a wealth of natural resources including geothermal, and hydropower. This presents a rare chance to lead the world in the generation of renewable energy. India has the capacity to draw in foreign businesses, develop into a global center for the production of clean energy, and increase exports of renewable battery technology and green hydrogen. India might develop a market worth up to \$80 billion by 2030 for low-carbon technologies. India is dedicated to sustainable development, growing its capacity for green energy, and lowering greenhouse gas emissions in response to the urgent climate danger. However, India requires help from the international community to shift its development onto a low-carbon trajectory. The ‘Make in India’ initiative, efficient resource utilization, and renewable energy harnessing set the stage for a greener, more sustainable future.

Let’s embark on this journey with unyielding positivity and boundless enthusiasm, shaping a future interwoven with sustainability and prosperity.


To achieve this, an online battery monitoring system has been installed in our UPS Room at HO Noida.

Jaggery, for instance, is an unrefined natural sweetener, often touted

Fibre slows down the breakdown of food and therefore slows down the absorption of sugars in the blood. Artificial sweeteners are made in the lab; they do not contain fiber, vitamins, and minerals and do not administer the same positive health effects as natural sugars do

as a super-food due to its higher vitamin and mineral content and lower sucrose levels compared to sugar. Nevertheless, even with its merits, it's wise to consume jaggery in moderation, recognizing that it is still a form of sugar. Among other common natural sugar substitutes, honey, a natural sweetener produced by honeybees, is rich in nutrients like potassium, magnesium, iron, and calcium. Coconut sugar, maple syrup, unsweetened fruit jelly, and sugarcane molasses also act as healthier alternatives to sugar.



In most cases, natural sugars prove to be a preferable choice compared to both artificial sweeteners and regular table sugar. However, individuals with diabetes or prediabetes should still exercise caution with some natural sugars.

Artificial sweeteners come with various potential health risks, including adverse effects on gut health, increased insulin resistance, altered appetite regulation, elevated sugar cravings, elevated risk of heart disease, potential carcinogenic risks, headaches, elevated risk of depression, increased risk of seizures, potential risk of skin rashes and many more.





In order to **truly start working** towards removing such barriers, **employers first need to understand that they**


